People who prefer ST	Are interested in: Facts about real things and useful, practical information about everyday activities	Learn best by: Doing, hands on activities	And need: Precise step-by-step instructions; logical, practical reasons for doing something
People who prefer SF	Useful practical information about people and a friendly environment	Doing, hands on activities with others	Precise step-by-step instructions; frequent, friendly interaction and approval
People who prefer NF	New ideas about how to understand people, symbolic and metaphorical activities	Imagining, creating with others, writing	General direction with freedom to do it their own way; frequent positive feedback
People who prefer NT	Theories and global explanations about why the world works the way it does	Categorising, analysing, applying logic	To be given a big problem to solve, an intellectual challenge, and then to be allowed to work it out
